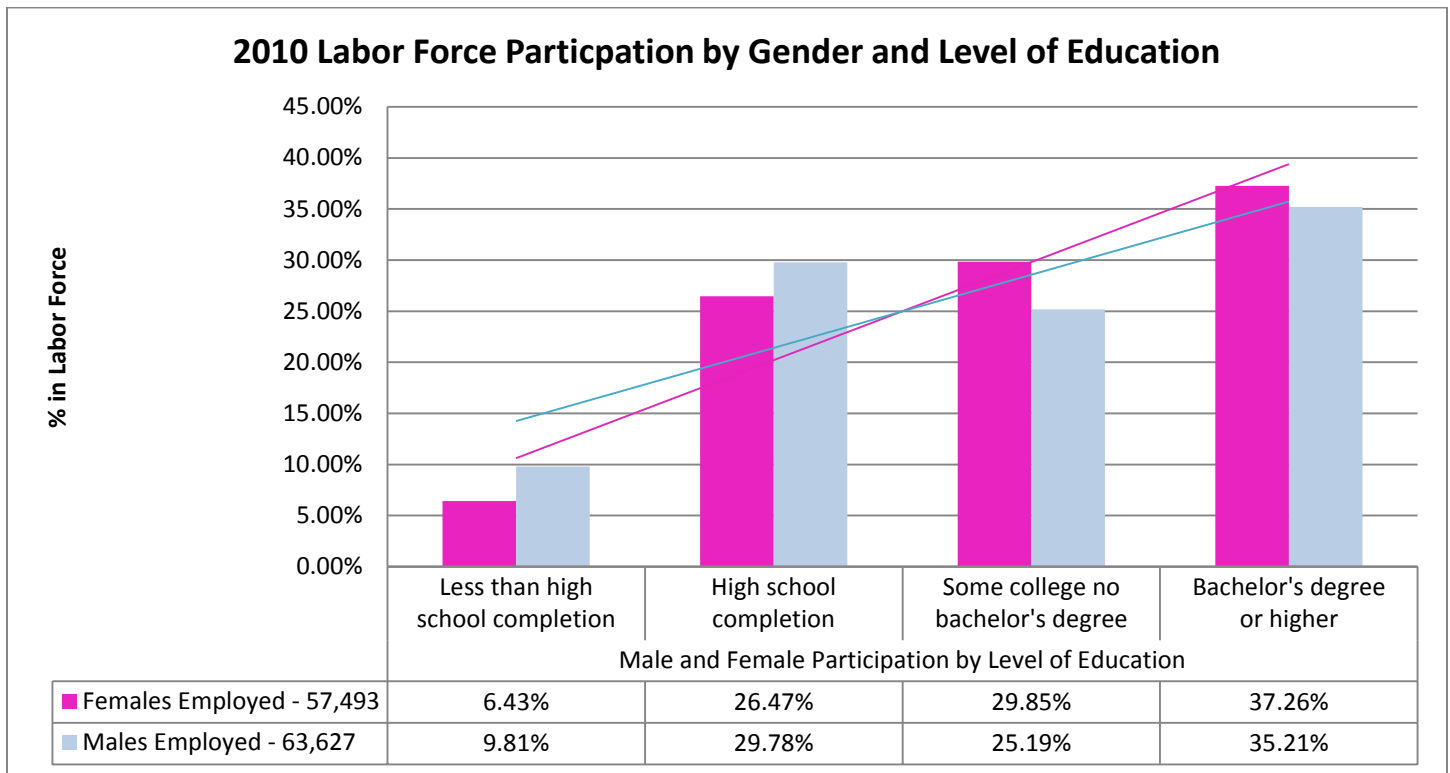

 SUBJECT: 2010 LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATES

Below is the visual representation for the data obtained from the United States Census Bureau depicting the percentages of males and females employed in the labor force in 2010 by level of education.

Analysis of the data indicates an upward trend in the percentage of employed females in the labor force as their level of education increased. Males with high school completion or less occupied 6.69% more of the labor force than females of the same level of education. Subsequently, females with some college but no bachelor’s degree combined with those holding a bachelor’s degree or higher occupied 6.71% more of the labor force than males of the same level of education.
